BEST TUNING

There is an unofficial competition going on among suppliers to turn out the killer tune that makes their skis feel the best they can. At Ski Canada we suspect that the fabulous tuning is the main reason why some testers come back year after year. Every brand had days when they hit the wax, but for sheer consistency in the perfect-tune department, nobody could touch Dave "Army" Armstrong at Atomic. Years of World Cup experience showed every day. Atomic was closely followed by Head, Salomon and Nordica.

BEST SENSE OF HUMOUR

Scott skis were sent to the test via a series of contacts and drop-off points. Through a comedy of errors and bad timing, the skis never made it to Panorama but they were tested the following week in the Silver Star park. Despite two weeks of phone calls, Scott's Aaron Barsanti never once lost his cool.

OVERACHIEVERS

The Stöckli Sinox Fun and Salomon X-Wing Tornado, both tested by the women, shared the amazing average overall satisfaction rating of 87 per cent, the highest numbers recorded during the week.
